**DECEMBER 26, 1863**

At a meeting held this Twenty Sixth day of December in the Year of our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred and Sixty Three at the School House in School District No. Five (5) in the Township of Genoa County of Livingston and State of Michigan in pursuance of a Notice heretofore given in accordance with Section 1722 of the Compiled Laws of 1857 W.C. Hight was chosen Chairman there of and L. Walker appointed Secretary.

After said meeting was called to order and duly organized N. Kriseler presented the same with a copy of the notices posted by him for the call of said meeting certifying upon oath that said notices had been posted agreeable to Law which said copy together with the Application of Citizens and warrant of Justice was filed with the Secretary.

Meeting then adopted Articles of Association, which were as follows viz:

To all whom these pursuits may concern:

We whose names and seals are affixed to this document do hereby certify that on the Twenty Sixth day of December in the year 1863 we have associated together and by these pursuits do associate together organizing a corporation by the name of Genoa Burying Ground Association for the purpose of acquiring title to the Burying Ground Association for the purpose of acquiring title to the Burying Ground situated on Section Twenty Eight (28) in the Township of Genoa and for purchasing other lands contiguous thereto for a burial ground for the dead, to dispose of rights of burial therein and to fence improve, monument and keep the same in suitable condition therefor notice hearing been first given in accordance with the Statute in such case made such provider. This Corporation shall commence from the date hereof and be perpetual.

**In testimony whereof we the members of this Corporation have subscribed our names and affixed our Seals this 26<sup>th</sup> day of December A.D. 1863.**

**Association then proceeded to adopt the following By Laws viz:**

**Section 1.** The officers of this Corporation shall consist of a President, Clerk, Treasurer and Sexton who shall be chosen by ballot and such other offices as may hereafter be deemed necessary and provided for in the By Laws thereof.

**Section 2.** The annual meeting of this corporation for the Election of Officers and the transaction of business shall be held on the first Wednesday of December of each year at the School House in District No. 5 in the Township of Genoa Livingston County Michigan.

**Section 3.** The Clerk shall call a special meeting upon the written application of any three members specifying the objects of the meeting: provided no business shall be transacted other than that specified in the notice and of which and all other meetings of the Corporation he shall give at least ten days notice by posting up notices thereof in three public places in the Township.

**Section 4.** The Officers specified in section one shall hold their offices for one year or until their successors are elected and qualified.

**Notice is hereby given that a Special Meeting of the Genoa Burying Ground Association will be held at the School House in School District No. 5 in the Township of Genoa on Saturday the twenty third (23) day of April A.D. 1864 at one o'clock P.M. for the purpose of acquiring a title to the burying ground Situated on Section twenty eight (28) in Said Township, and for purchasing other lands contiguous thereto for a burial ground for the dead, and to dispose of rights of burial therein, and to fence, improve, ornament, and keep the same in suitable condition.**

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**April 23, 1864**

At a Special Meeting of the Genoa Burying Ground Association held this twenty-third (23) day of April A.D. 1864 at the schoolhouse specified in the above notice and in pursuance of said notice. Joseph Rider was chosen chairman. The Clerk being present said meeting was called to order and duly organized.

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On motion the Clerk was instructed to procure a deed of the Burying Ground situated on Sec (28) in said Township of Genoa, running to W. Krisler, from the Town, as soon as convenient.

On motion Joseph Rider was instructed to examine the fence around the Burying Ground and if the fence needs repairing, to employ some person to repair the same and keep it in good repair.

On motion, the meeting adjourned to the sixth day of May next at this schoolhouse at one o'clock P.M.

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**May 6, 1864**

At an adjourned meeting held at the schoolhouse in school district 5. In the Township of Genoa this sixth day of May A.D. 1864 the president being present said meeting was called to order and duly organized. On motion a committee was appointed by the chair to purchase land of Mr. Krisler and of Mr. Walker joining the old burying ground, one tier of lots on north side of old burying of Mr. Walker and as much or Mr. Krisler as the committee think best-said committee are to measure the ground purchased and ascertain the exact amount purchased. W. B. Curtis, O. H. Winager, Alexander Carpenter were appointed said committee.

On motion a committee of three was elected to draft a set of by Laws L. Walker, Joseph Rider, Charles Benedict were elected said committee.

On motion the committee on purchasing additional ground be organised to make two maps of said burying ground leaving in North East corner os said burying ground six lots for Potters Field.

**On motion the meeting adjourned Sine Dic.**

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**December 5, 1864**

At the annual meeting of the Genoa burying ground association held at the Schoolhouse in school dist No. 5 this seventh day of December 1864 the President and Clerk being present said meeting was called to order.

On motion the committee on purchasing additional ground to the old burying ground report that they have purchased of Leland Walker (33 rods & 28/100) thirty three rods and twenty eight one hundreths of a rod for the sum of five dollars also one acre and sixty four rods & 47/100 of a rod of Nicholas Krisler for which they agree to pay \$27.13 twenty seven dollars and thirteen cents, the above is adopted.

On motion the committee appointed to draft additional by Laws report that they have agreed upon the following a recommend their adoption



**Sec 5** Any two of the Officers named in sec one shall have power to fill any vacancy in office by appointment in writing under their hands which appointment shall be recorded by the clerk.

**Sec 6** All persons elected or appointed to any office of this association shall within ten days after such election or appointment file with the clerk a written acceptance of the office-together with a bond if required or said officer will be vacant.

**Sec 7** The Clerk of this association shall within two days after the election of any person to office who was not present at the election notify such person of his election and any person attending the meeting for the election of officers and elected there at to any office shall be deemed to have been duly notified of his election.

**Sec 8** The Treasurer shall give a bond to this association with sufficient sureties to be approved by the President for which the amount of monies to come into his hands as such treasurer conditioned for the faithful discharges of his duties which bond shall be filed with the Clerk.

**Sec 9** The officers of this association shall receive such reasonable compensation of their services as shall be allowed at any regular meeting.

**Sec 10** Any person owning a right of burial in the ground of this association and having the right to use the same shall be deemed a stock-holder and entitled to vote at all meetings thereof and to all the rights and privilege of a membership.

**Sec 11** The grounds of this association shall be laid out in Lots 9 by 10 feet with convenient walks and alleys between them and a right of burial shall the right to bury the dead in and upon one of said Lots.

**Sec 12** This association shall at any regular meeting thereof have power to make an assessment upon the stockholders which assessment shall be per rate per lot. Provided no assessment shall be made at a special meeting ample notice thereof shall have been given as required by Sec 3 of the by Laws.

**Sec 13** When an assessment has been made as provided for in the next proceeding section the Clerk shall make a record thereof showing the day when the same was made with a list of the names of all the stockholders and the amount assessed to each stockholder and the amount assessed to each stockholder and shall furnish the treasurer with a true copy of the same.

**Sec 14** Within one month from the time of making any assessment the Clerk shall cause a notice thereof to be published for twelve successive weeks in the newspaper printed nearest to the burial ground which notice shall state when such assessment was made with a list of the names of all the stockholders and the amount assessed to each and directing each stockholder to pay his assessment to the Treasurer. And if any such stockholder shall neglect or refuse to pay his assessment for six month from the time when such assessment was made all right of such stockholders under this association shall cease and all rights of burial owned by him shall revert to the association.

**Sec 15** This association shall have power to dispose of that part of any forfeited right of burial, which has not been actually used as a repository of the dead, in like manner as if the same had never been granted.

**Sec 16** The President shall have power and it shall be his duty to preside of which he shall be present to preserve order and decorum during all deliberations of the association and any person refusing to comply or submit to the decision of the chair may be excluded from the further deliberations of that meeting, provided such fractious person may appeal from the decision of the chair in which case said appeal shall be determined by a majority vote of the members present. He shall countersign all orders drawn on the treasurer by the clerk and for the disbursement of moneys and all certificates of right of burial when presented in the form prescribed in the twenty ninth section of the act under which this association was organized.

**Sec 17** In case the President shall not be present at any regular meeting the stockholders present may by a viva vox vote elect one of their numbers as temporary President, who shall for the time being possess all the powers and duties of the president.

**Sec 18** The Clerk shall keep a record of all proceedings of the association: he shall give the required notice of all meetings. Draw all orders on the Treasurer for the disbursement of moneys and present the same to the President for his countersignation and keep an account of the same with the amount thereof and the name of the person to whom drawn. He shall keep a record of all rights of burial disposed of in the form prescribed in the twenty ninth section of an act relating to Burying Grounds. He shall procure a sufficient number of blanks of the form therein prescribed, bound in convenient form with an index in which shall be entered alphabetically the names of all persons of rights of burial in the grounds of this association.

**Sec 19** The price of rights of burial in the grounds of this association shall be Three dollars \$3.00.

**Sec 20** Upon payment to the Treasurer, the price of a right of burial it shall be his duty to give the purchaser a receipt thereof which receipt shall accurately describe the premises on which payment has been made and upon presenting said receipt to the clerk it shall be his duty to issue to the purchaser a certificate of right of burial signed by the Clerk and Countersigned by the President in the form prescribed in the twenty ninth section of the act under which this association was organized.

**Sec 21** It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to receive and safely keep all moneys belonging to the association and pay them out on the order of the clerk, countersigned by the President.

~~**Sec 22** The Sexton shall have the general care of the grounds and see that no injury or trespass be committed thereon. He shall dig or cause the same to be done all graves; and the same shall be at least five feet deep and fill the same for which service he may receive. Not to exceed two dollar and fifty cents from the person who employs him.~~

**Sec 23** It shall be competent for this association at any regular meeting thereof to prohibit the cultivation of obnoxious plants and shrubbery in their grounds. Provided the same receives the vote of two thirds of all the stockholders present.

**Sec 24** Additions, alterations and amendments may be made to these By Laws at any regular meeting of the at least three months before.

**Sec 25** any annual meeting may be adjourned from time to time after the election of officers at which adjourned meeting any business may be transacted the same as at an annual meeting by giving at least ten days notice. The By Laws are adopted.

On motion the meeting adjourned to meet the 12<sup>th</sup> day of December next at the Schoolhouse in district No. 5 at 6 o'clock P.M.
