EASEMENT FOR A PUBLIC ROAD

On this ______ day of ______ 2011, for one dollar, Grantor grants to Grantee a nonexclusive easement ("Easement") for a public road on land called the Easement Areas.

"Grantor" is:

International Transmission Company, a Michigan corporation 27175 Energy Way, Novi, Michigan 48377.

"Grantee" is: The Township of Genoa, a Michigan municipal corporation, 2911 Dorr Road, Brighton, Michigan 48116.

The "Easement Areas" are described as:

A 66 foot wide strip of land on over and across a parcel of land located A) in the Southwest 1/4 of Section 4, Town 2 North, Range 5 East, Genoa Township, Livingston County, Michigan. Said road easement is described as follows; Commencing at the South 1/4 corner of said Section 4; thence North 89°14'44" West, 1314.00 feet, along the South line of said Section 4; thence North 02°00'42" East, 272.53 feet, to the POINT OF BEGINNING; thence along a non-tangent curve to the right in the Northwest direction having an Arc Distance of 88.13 feet, a Radius of 333.00 feet, a central angle of 15°09'47". and a Chord Bearing and Distance of North 33°02'48" West 87.87 feet; thence along a curve to the left having an Arc Distance of 13.29 feet, a Radius of 257.29 feet, a central angle of 2°57'32", and a Chord Bearing and Distance of North 26°56'46" West, 13.29 feet; thence North 28°25'32" West 4.14 feet; thence North 02°00'42" East, 111.90 feet; thence along a non-tangent curve to the right having an Arc Distance of 67.91 feet, a Radius of 246.00 feet, a central angle of 15°48'59", and a Chord Bearing and Distance of South 36°20'01" East, 67.69 feet; thence South 28°25'32" East, 33.57 feet; thence South 02°00'42" West, 116.99 feet to the point of beginning. Said road easement is described as follows; Commencing at the South 1/4 corner of said Section 4; thence North 89°14'44" West, 1314.00 feet, along the South line of said Section 4; thence North 02°00'42" East 272.53 feet; thence along a non-tangent curve to the right in the Northwest direction having an Arc Distance of 88.13 feet, a Radius of 333.00 feet a central angle of 15°09'47", and a Chord Bearing and Distance of North 33°02'48" West, 87.87 feet; thence along a curve to the left having an Arc Distance of 13.29 feet a Radius of 257.29 feet, a central angle of 2°57'32", and a Chord Bearing and Distance of North 26°56'46" West, 13.29 feet; thence North 28°25'32" West 4.14 feet; thence North 28°25'32" West 29.43 feet; thence along a curve to the left having an Arc Distance of 111.85 feet a Radius of 180.00 feet a central angle of 35°36'l0", and a Chord Bearing and Distance of North 46°13'37" West, 110.06 feet, to the POINT OF BEGINNING; thence along a curve to the left having an Arc Distance of 26.54 feet, a Radius of 180.00 feet, a central angle of 8°26'57", and a Chord Bearing and Distance of North 68°15'11" West, 26.52 feet; thence North 72°28'39" West, 35.32 feet; thence North 02°00'42" East, 68.49 feet along the Easterly property line of Flint Substation property; thence South 72°28'39" East, 53.64 feet; thence along a curve to the right having an Arc Distance of 7.62 feet a Radius of 246.00 feet a central angle of 1°46'31", and a Chord Bearing and Distance of South 71°35'23" East, 7.62 feet; thence South 02°00'42" West 70.40 feet, to the point of beginning. Containing 0.09 acres of land in area more or less.

1. Grantor grants this non-exclusive easement upon the Easement Areas to Grantee for the purpose of providing a means for the public to travel on a road that was constructed and is maintained by Grantee.

2. Grantor specifically reserves the right to use the Easement Areas for any purpose, including but not limited to the construction, reconstruction, operation and maintenance of overhead and underground electric transmission, and communication lines and associated structures and equipment ("Grantor's Facilities") on, over and under the Easement Areas and the right to allow others to use the Easement Areas so long as such uses do not unreasonably interfere with the intended use of the Easement by Grantee and the public as provided herein. Grantor's use of the Easement Areas shall not in any way be unreasonably restricted, limited, conditioned, or interfered with as a result of the granting of this Easement.

3. This Easement is granted without any warranties or covenants of title, and subject to all currently existing easements, restrictions and encumbrances affecting the Easement Areas to which this easement would be subordinate under the recording acts or other applicable laws of the State of Michigan.

4. Grantee's use of the Easement Areas pursuant to this Easement shall not in any way interfere with Grantor's utility facilities now or hereafter located on said land or the adjoining land. Without limiting the foregoing, Grantee shall comply with the following requirements:

- a) All contractors and subcontractors shall contact the Utility Communications System (Miss Dig), phone number (800) 482-7171, prior to performing any excavation in the Easement Areas, in accordance with Michigan Compiled Law 460.701 et seq.
- b) Final construction plans shall be submitted to Grantor's Real Estate Department before commencing any reconstruction work on Grantor's land, except in case of emergency and except in the case of minor repairs. Plans shall be submitted at least 30 days prior to the proposed date of reconstruction.
- c) No fill may be permanently placed on the Easement Areas without Grantor's prior written consent.
- d) Grantee shall take appropriate measures to prevent erosion during Grantee's construction activities on the Easement Areas and shall reseed all disturbed areas with warm season grasses after any construction is complete.
- e) Any construction equipment operated on Grantor's land or the Easement Areas shall at all times maintain a minimum separation of 15 feet from any energized conductor. If more

stringent, MIOSHA standards shall be observed. No dump trucks shall lift their beds under the electric lines that cross over the Easement Areas.

5. No trees or shrubs may be planted on the Easement Areas.

6. No above-ground structures may be located within the Easement Areas, except road signs may be placed in accordance with the requirements of the Michigan Department of Transportation, the Livingston County Road Commission, and the Township of Genoa.

7. No materials may be stored on the Easement Areas.

8. All work performed on the Easement Areas shall be performed in compliance with all applicable land use laws and regulations, including by way of illustration and not limitation, laws and regulations requiring wetland and soil erosion permits. No application for such permits, licenses, and authorizations shall name Grantor as the applicant or responsible party. Before entering or commencing any reconstruction work on the Easement Areas (excluding emergency repairs and minor repairs), Grantee shall provide a copy of any permits, licenses, and other authorizations it obtains to Grantor's Real Estate Department, 27175 Energy Way, Novi, Michigan 48377.

9. Grantee, to the full extent it may lawfully do so, shall indemnify, defend, and hold Grantor harmless from and against all liabilities, claims, costs, and expenses (including attorney fees) for death or personal injury and property damage arising in connection with or as a direct or indirect result of the use of the Easement Areas pursuant to this Easement, however caused, whether such death, injury, loss, or damage is due or claimed to be due to Grantee's negligence, Grantor's and Grantee's concurrent negligence, any other person's negligence, or otherwise, excepting Grantor's sole negligence.

10. Grantee shall require all contractors and their subcontractors who perform work on the Easement Areas to assume all liability for and protect, indemnify, and save Grantor, its successors and assigns, harmless from and against all action, claims, demands, judgments, losses, expenses of suits or actions and attorney fees, for death or injury to any person and loss or damage to the property of any person, including the parties hereto and their agents, contractors, subcontractors, and employees, arising in connection with or as a direct or indirect result of the rights and privileges hereby granted, whether such injury, death, loss, or damage is due or claimed to be due to Grantee's negligence, Grantor's negligence, the negligence of any such contractor or subcontractor, the combined negligence of either or both of the parties hereto and any one or more of said contractors or subcontractors, the negligence of any other person, or otherwise, excepting only Grantor's sole negligence.

11. Grantee and any contractors performing work on behalf of Grantee on the Easement Areas must maintain an insurance policy naming ITC as an additional insured on the policy providing coverage for bodily injury, personal injury, and/or property damage liability at a minimum of Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000.00) per occurrence and in the aggregate. The insurance policy must be primary and not contributory and shall waive the right of recovery or subrogation against ITC unless the injuries were caused by the gross negligence or willful and wanton misconduct of ITC. Prior to use of the Easement Areas, Grantee must provide to ITC a certificate evidencing the above coverage, which certificate must provide that the insurer will give ITC at least 10 days prior written notice of any cancellation of or material change in the insurance policy.

12. In the event that use of Grantor's land pursuant to this Easement at any time results in the presence on or under Grantor's land (which shall include but not be limited to the groundwater underlying the Easement Areas) of contaminants, hazardous waste, hazardous substances or constituents, or toxic substances, as currently or hereafter defined in applicable laws, Grantee shall, without cost to Grantor, promptly take: 1) all actions that are required by any federal, state, or local governmental agency or political subdivision, and 2) all actions that are necessary to restore Grantor's land to the condition existing prior to the introduction of such contaminants, hazardous waste, hazardous substances or constituents, or toxic substances, notwithstanding any lesser standard of remediation allowable under applicable law or governmental policies. The actions required by Grantee shall include,

but not be limited to: a) the investigation of the environmental condition of Grantor's land, b) the preparation of any feasibility studies, reports, or remedial plans required by law or governmental policy, and c) the performance of cleanup, remediation, containment, operation, maintenance, monitoring, or restoration work, whether on or off Grantor's land. Grantee shall proceed continuously and diligently with such investigatory and remedial actions. Grantee shall promptly provide to Grantor, free of charge, copies of all test results and reports generated in connection with the above activities and copies of all reports submitted to any governmental entity. No cleanup, remediation, restoration, or other work required by this paragraph shall require or result in the imposition of any limitation or restriction on the use of Grantor's land, without Grantor's prior written approval and permission. Notwithstanding the above, Grantee shall have no obligation under this paragraph for any contamination caused by Grantor or by anyone acting on behalf of or through Grantor and Grantor's assigns.

13. Grantee shall also, to the full extent it may lawfully do so, indemnify, defend, and hold Grantor, its officers, employees, agents, affiliates, and parent corporation, harmless from and against any and all losses, liabilities, claims, damages, payments, actions, recoveries, settlements, judgments, orders, costs, expenses, attorney fees, penalties, fines, encumbrances, and liens arising out of: a) the presence on or beneath Grantor's land, including but not limited to the groundwater underlying the Easement Area, of contaminants, hazardous waste, hazardous substances or constituents, or toxic substances, as currently or hereafter defined in applicable laws, as a result of use of Grantor's land pursuant to this Easement; b) Grantee's violation or alleged violation of any federal, state, or local law related directly or indirectly to Grantee's exercise of the rights herein granted; or c) Grantee's failure to comply with the terms and conditions of this Easement. Notwithstanding the above, Grantee shall have no obligation under this paragraph for any contamination caused by Grantor or by anyone acting on behalf of or through Grantor and Grantor's assigns.

14. This Easement is subject to any licenses, leases, easements, or other interests in the land heretofore granted by Grantor or its predecessors in title and to any such interests reserved to other parties in instruments granted to Grantor or its predecessors in title. Grantee is responsible for complying with any applicable requirements, including notice and consent requirements, of such licenses, leases, easements, and other interests.

15. Grantee shall be responsible for the maintenance of the Easement Areas.

16. Grantee's acceptance of this Easement shall be deemed an acceptance of the terms and conditions of this grant.

17. If Grantee fails to comply with any of the provisions of this Easement, Grantor shall have the right to revoke this Easement by giving Grantee 60 days written notice of such revocation; provided, however, that Grantor shall first advise Grantee in writing of such non-compliance and shall give Grantee a reasonable opportunity to cure such non-compliance to Grantor's reasonable satisfaction.

18. If the road is not used for road or utility facility purposes for a continuous period of 5 years, then in such event, all right and interest hereby conveyed shall automatically terminate and revest in Grantor, its successors and assigns.

19. The benefits hereof shall accrue to and the obligations shall bind the respective successors and assigns of the parties.

GENOA TOWNSHIP CODE OFFICIAL EMPLOYMENT AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT is made by and between, GENOA TOWNSHIP, with office at 2911 Dorr Road, Brighton, Michigan 48116, hereinafter referred to as "Employer" and Dennis Smith, of 922 Main Street, Fenton, Michigan 48430, hereinafter referred to as "Code Official."

- 1. Employer hereby employs and Code Official hereby accepts employment subject to the terms of this Agreement as hereinafter set forth.
- 2. The Initial Term of this Agreement shall commence upon determination by the Michigan Construction Code Commission that Genoa Charter Township is permitted to enforce the single state construction code and end on December 31, 2012, unless sooner terminated by either party as provided herein. This Agreement shall extend for successive one (1) year terms unless terminated at least thirty (30) days prior to the expiration of the Initial Term or the Renewal Term as applicable.
- 3. The duties of the Code Official shall include such work as may be required by Employer together with the described duties as recited in **Attachment A** attached hereto. The Code Official position is a part time position. The Code Official shall work 32 hours per week for Employer with the specific hours to be reasonably determined by Chief Administrative Officer. In addition, the Code Official shall, at no cost, occasionally attend Township Board meetings as directed by the Township Manager, Supervisor, Clerk or Treasurer. Regular attendance is not contemplated at this time. If regular attendance is required in the future this contract may be modified.
- 4. During working hours, the Code Official shall devote his full time and attention and his best energies and abilities to the performance of such duties as may be assigned to him by Employer, and shall serve Employer faithfully and diligently and use his utmost endeavors to promote the interests of Employer.
- 5. The Code Official represents and warrants that he is licensed and properly registered as required by law and will comply with all applicable laws during the term of this Agreement including, but not limited to, the Stille-Derossett-Hale Single State Construction Code Act, MCL 125.1501, et.seq, the Building Officials and Inspectors Registration Act, MCL 338.2301, et.seq., and the Occupational Code, MCL 339.101, et.seq. The Code Official further warrants and represents that he will, during the term of this Agreement, enforce the Michigan Building Code and the Genoa Township Ordinances within Genoa Township on behalf of Employer. The Code Official further represents and warrants that he possesses all skills, knowledge and abilities to competently, timely and professionally perform the Services of the Code Official as required by law and that the services will be performed in a good and competent manner. The Code Official shall provide Employer with a copy of all licenses and registrations required by this Agreement.

- 6. This contract may be terminated without cause by the Township upon the giving of thirty (30) days notice to the Code Official. Likewise, the Code Official may terminate this contract on thirty (30) days notice to the Township.
- 7. Employer agrees to pay Code Official and Code Official agrees to accept as compensation, Forty-Nine thousand, Six Hundred Four and 00/100 Dollars (\$49,604) per year based on twelve months. Payment for the 2011 year shall be pro-rated based on actual months worked. The sums shall be paid to the Code Official in equal biweekly payments during the term of the contract. The Code Official shall submit weekly time sheets to the Township Manager or Chief Administrative Officer as directed.
- 8. Employer agrees to pay the Code Official for incidental expenses incurred in relation to activities approved by the Township in accordance with Township policies.
- 9. The Code Official shall have all other benefits as described in the Genoa Township Personnel and Policy Manual as may be modified from time to time by the Employer.
- 10. The Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the Code Official and his heirs and assigns and personal representatives and the Township of Genoa, a general law township.

ATTACHMENT A CODE OFFICIAL RESPONSIBILITIES

The following are responsibilities of the Building Code Official:

- 1. Enforcement of building codes.
- 2. Issuance, suspension, revocation or cancellation of building permits.
- 3. Providing written code violation notices.
- 4. Assist in the establishment of fees.
- 5. Providing official orders and notices.
- 6. Issue "Stop Work" orders for work done without a permit
- 7. Issue "Dangerous Building Notices"
- 8. Review files for buildings being completed and issue Certificates of Occupancy where applicable
- 9. Review monthly reports and annual reports for work performed and fees collected among other activities in a format acceptable to the Township
- 10. Meet with applicants for pre-submittal courtesy reviews
- 11. Work in unison with the Brighton Area Fire Authority to ensure compliance with any applicable fire codes and to be certain that all commercial and multi-family residential structures have been properly inspected prior to issuing a Certificate of Occupancy
- 12. Provide advice, education, and support to the Township Board and department heads regarding code interpretations and adoptions
- 13. Fulfill all the duties and legal requirements set forth by the State of Michigan Building Codes and the Township Code of Ordinances
- 14. Oversee qualified and certified personnel to perform inspections, plan review and Building Code Official duties as required by the State of Michigan
- 15. Review and respond to all Freedom of Information Act ("FOIA") requests in compliance with the Township's FOIA procedure and review all subpoenas or requests for any documents or information concerning court cases
- 16. Review and determine all fee disputes with third parties
- 17. Facilitate and assist the Building Code Board of Appeals for the Township and maintain records
- 18. Interpret and decide all building code questions requiring official action within the Building Department
- 19. Provide all other services under State Law, the Township Code of Ordinances, Resolutions of the Township Board or as implied under the duties and scope of services listed in this Agreement.

LETTER OF UNDERSTANDING ADDENDUM TO EMPLOYMENT AGREEMENT BETWEEN DENNIS SMITH AND GENOA CHARTER TOWNSHIP

Dennis Smith has been employed by Genoa Charter Township as a Building Official. Dennis Smith and the Township have executed a separate agreement specifying the terms and conditions of this employment. The intent of this Letter of Understanding is to further describe the Township's expectations in terms of Mr. Smith's work schedule.

Mr. Smith is expected to work 32 hours per week. His typical work day will include a 30 minute paid lunch. A typical work week will consist of four, six and one half hours per day (4 @ 6.5 hours) and one six hour day (1 @ 6 hours). The number of actual hours worked each day may vary depending on Building Department activity and schedule. Mr. Smith will coordinate any changes to this schedule with the Township Manager.
