Supervisor McCririe called the regular meeting of the board to order at 6:30 p.m. The Pledge of Allegiance was then said. The following board members were present constituting a quorum for the transaction of business: Gary McCririe, Paulette Skolarus, Robin Hunt, Linda Rowell, Jim Mortensen, Todd Smith and Jean Ledford. Also present were: Township Manager Michael Archinal and approximately seven persons in the audience.

A Call to the Public was made with no response.

Approval of Consent Agenda:

Moved by Ledford and supported by Mortensen to approve all items listed under the Consent Agenda as requested. The motion carried unanimously.

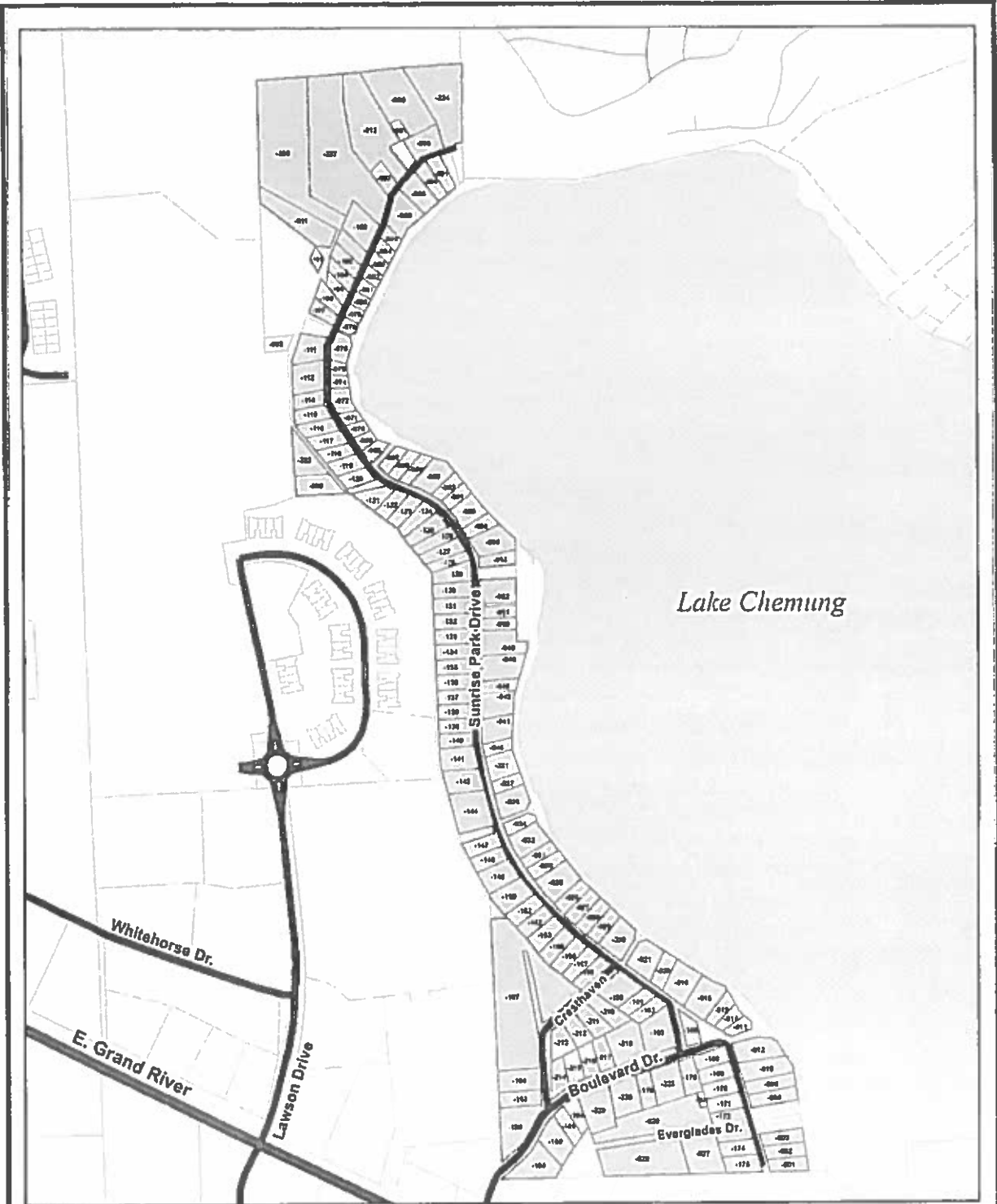

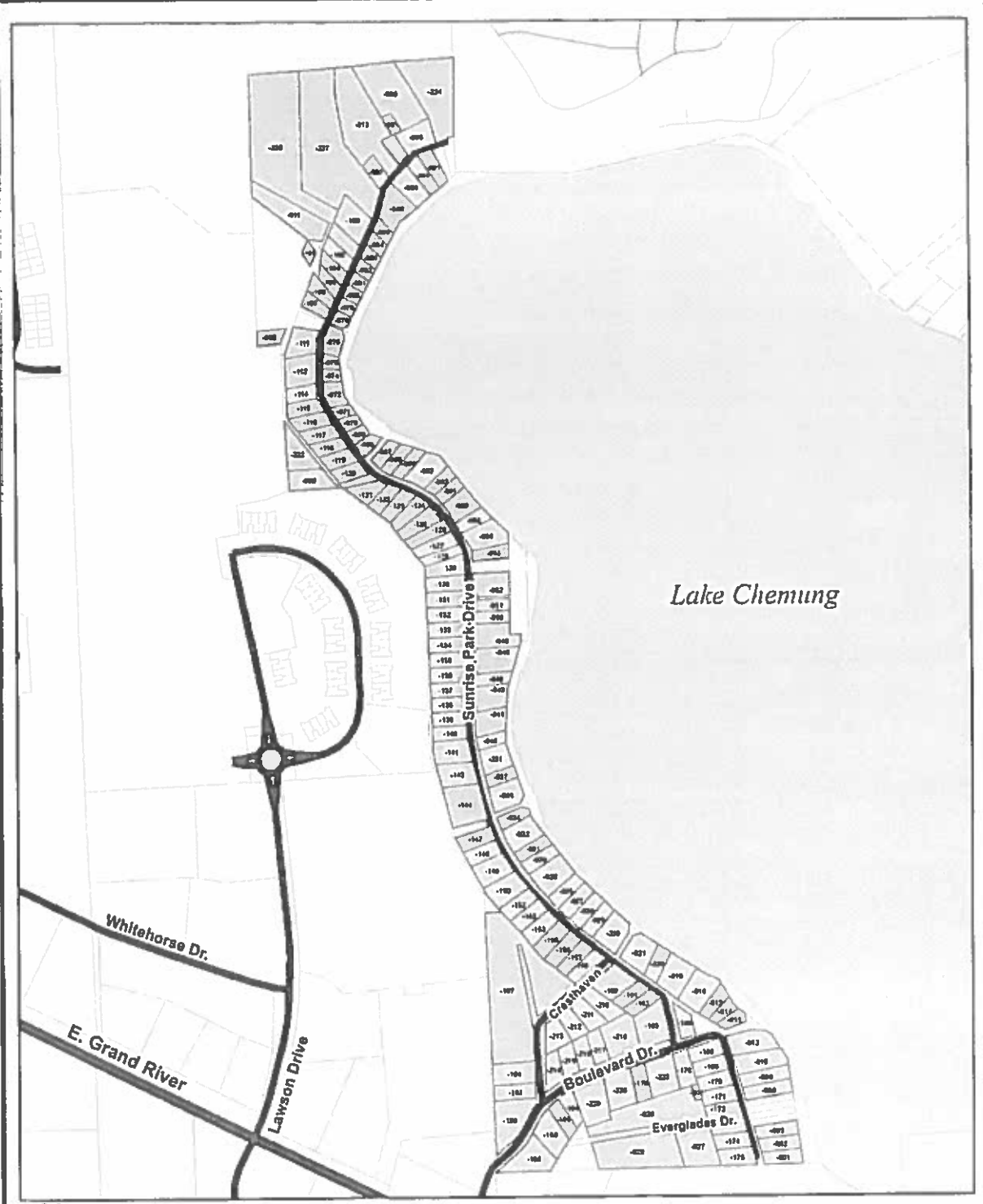

Summarizing new federal transportation funding bill

It's called Fixing America's Surface Transportation Act, or FAST Act

On December 4, 2015, President Obama signed into law the Fixing America's Surface Transportation Act or "FAST Act." It is the first law enacted in over 10 years that provides long-term funding certainty for surface transportation. This means that states, transit agencies, and local governments can move forward on critical transportation projects with confidence that federal funds will be available.

Overall, the FAST Act largely maintains current program structures and funding shares between highways and transit. It increases funding by 11 percent over five years. This is far short of the amount needed to improve roads and bridges and transit systems to meet the increasing demands on our transportation systems. On the highway side, the bill provides \$225 billion in funding over five years, increasing funding from \$41 billion in 2015 to \$47 billion in 2020. For transit, the act increases dedicated bus funding by 89 percent over the life of the law.

The law also makes changes and reforms to many federal transportation programs, including streamlining the approval processes for new transportation projects, providing new safety tools, and establishing new programs to advance critical freight projects.

More detailed descriptions of how the FAST Act will affect each mode of transportation and what it means for funding for transportation agencies in Southeast Michigan will be coming early next year.

The impact of new state transportation funding plan

The chart below shows the estimated impact of the new transportation funding plan on local road agencies, which include counties, cities and villages.

Local agencies will see a significant boost in funding for the current state fiscal year, which began in October, based on a large infusion of General Fund revenue from the state budget. None of this additional revenue is expected to continue once the new taxes and fees go into effect on January 1, 2017. This means little growth in total revenue distributed to locals in 2017, as the new funding plan is implemented. This is especially true in 2017 if the state does not release the funds withheld in the "lockbox." These funds are being withheld by the legislature until such time that they believe the Michigan Department of Transportation has developed a plan that will significantly reduce the long-term cost of road construction.

The final concern for future transportation funding involves the use of state General Fund revenues to enhance funding beginning in 2019. As with any legislative plans that involve the future use of general revenue funds, there is no guarantee that these funds will actually remain dedicated for transportation purposes. That decision lies solely with the future legislatures.

MTA is asking township officials to contact Gov. Rick Snyder to urge his veto of Senate Bill 571 that would limit township communication to residents on local ballot questions 60 days prior to the election.

The bill, adopted in the final hours of session this week, would prohibit a public body’s ability to communicate to its residents on local ballot questions 60 days prior to the election—including local millage proposals, zoning referendums, annexation issues, proposals to reinstate annual meeting, incorporation as a Charter Township, establishment of a planning commission, or establishment of a public library, and referendums on issuing revenue bonds.

These changes were adopted in the final hours of session without notice, without public review and without discussion with any local government association. The substitute was not made available for public input or review before it was passed.

Among the changes, the bill bans public bodies – including townships – from using public money or resources (including facilities) within 60 days of an election to communicate any information—even purely factual information—about a local ballot question by radio, television, mass mailing or pre-recorded telephone message.

Townships would be prohibited from even informing electors of the ballot language itself or using public money or resources to respond to false information being disseminated.

It also could impact a township board’s decision to televise board meetings during that same 60-day period should a comment or question on the local ballot proposal occur at a board meeting. Many public bodies provide televised broadcasts of their meetings. Should SB 571 be enacted, the measure will put local governments that televise their meetings on public access channels at risk of violating the law if they so much as answer a question from the public or make mention of any local ballot question.

Per MCL 168.646a, a local unit must submit ballot wording to the county clerk 82 days prior, thereby leaving a very limited time period of 22 days to provide information to residents if SB 571 is enacted.

Section 57 would also prohibit public bodies from responding to questions from the news media for news stories about local ballot question on public property. For example, a township official would be unable to respond to an interview from broadcast or news media regarding a fire or ambulance millage proposal in a public building.

Finally, while the proposed change creates an inconsistent process for communicating with residents on local ballot questions versus statewide ballot questions.

For all reasons outlined above, please contact the Governor's office to urge a veto of SB 571.
